


Army remains committed to their welfare in every possible way". The camp catered to Veer Naris, Veer Matas, and ESM providing healthcare, emotional support

# KASHMIR'S CRAFT: BETWEEN TIMELESS BEAUTY AND FADING THREADS

ashmir's craft economy, long regarded as a cornerstone of its cultural and economic identity, has now been mapped district-wise, providing a detailed insight into its strengths and challenges. As of 31

March 2025, the Valley is home to 3.81 lakh registered artisans, underscoring the sector's critical role in sustaining livelihoods. Srinagar leads with 81,878 artisans, reaffirming its position as the epicenter of Kashmiri craftsmanship,



followed closely by Budgam and Baramulla districts celebrated for weaving, embroidery and other artisanal traditions. This mapping exercise not only highlights the geographic spread of skilled artisans but also captures the diversity of crafts flourishing across districts. While globally acclaimed traditions such as Sozni embroidery and hand-knotted carpets continue to thrive, others face an uncertain future. Silverware, willow bat making and several woodbased crafts are at risk of extinction due to falling demand, lack of innovation and competition from machine-made products. By identifying both flourishing and endangered crafts, the district-wise mapping is expected to guide policymakers and cultural organizations in preserving Kashmir's artisanal legacy while promoting pathways for sustainable growth.


## Khelo India Festival: Dragon Boats Thrill Dal Lake

Water Sports Festival (KIWSF) from 21 to 23 August. Kupwara Emerging as a Fisheries Hub with Trout & Carp Development



upwara District, blessed with abundant rivers, streams, springs and irrigation sars, offers immense scope for fisheries development in both trout and food fisheries. Since becoming a district in 1979, the Fisheries Department has undertaken several initiatives, including setting up a Carp Fish Farm at Kohru (Handwara), a Fish Seed Centre at Dewar Lolab and trout rearing units at Kutlari Handwara and Suliman Tangdar. To enhance fish production, carp seed has been stocked in Lolab, Kralpora, Handwara and Langate, while Brown and Rainbow Trout have been introduced in snow-fed streams such as Dringyari, Moori Kalaroos, Mawar and Hardkhi, promoting both fisheries and angling tourism. Encouragingly, private participation has expanded, with 83 carp ponds and 21 trout units established across the district, strengthening rural livelihoods. The department further supports Mahigeers through incentives like housing, nylon twine, scholarships and insurance schemes.
