Eurasian Moorhens Lead Bird Count at Dal Lake

al and Anchar Lakes in Kashmir welcomed nearly 15,000 migratory birds this winter, according to the Asian Waterbird Census (AWC) 2025. Dal Lake alone hosted 13,797 waterbirds with Eurasian Moorhens making up 78% of the total count, painting a vivid picture of biodiversity thriving in the Valley. The arrival of such large flocks underscores the ecological significance of Kashmir's wetlands as vital wintering grounds for migratory species. These ecosystems provide food, shelter and safe resting places, even as they struggle against pollution, encroachment and climate pressures. While the numbers are encouraging, they also serve as a wake-up call. Protecting Dal, Anchar and other wetlands is crucial to preserving this fragile balance and ensuring that Kashmir's skies continue to welcome migratory birds in the years ahead.
