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AN INTERVIEW WITH RESISTANCE COMMANDER HUNAIN KASHMIRI

Q1) Our enemies often claim that the armed resistance is in its last stages, or dying. What do you have to say about this?

Ans: It is true that the armed resistance is in its final stages. Over time, various factors have contributed to its decline, including changing ground realities, strategic shifts, and evolving public sentiment. While there have been operations in the past, the overall capacity and influence of the resistance have diminished significantly. This phase marks a natural progression, and the situation continues to evolve accordingly.

Q2) It's no hidden truth that the weapon supplies have dried up. Is the leadership in anyway trying to resolve this issue?

Ans: It's true that there is a scarcity of weapons, and despite efforts, the leadership has been unable to resolve this issue effectively. Various challenges have hindered resupply operations, making it increasingly difficult to establish reliable logistics and sources. While attempts were made, they have not yielded the desired results.

3) Recently, the JKP officials claimed that the total number of local resistance fighters operating in J&K is less than 40. How true is it?

Ans: It is evident that the numbers are decreasing day by day, and the resistance is gradually fading. Various factors, including operational challenges and lack of recruitment, have contributed to this decline. While efforts were made to sustain the movement, the reality is that active participation has significantly reduced, signalling the inevitable weakening of the resistance.

4) We often see the news of resistance workers being arrested. Are resistance groups taking any practical steps to stop it?

Ans: Especially post-abrogation of Article 370, the situation has become increasingly difficult. Every passing day, there are reports of mass arrests and harassment of those associated with the movement. However, no effective steps have been taken to counter this, and the reality is that the movement has failed to respond. The ability to resist has significantly weakened, leaving little room for any substantial action.

5) The elections last year saw massive turnout, except in district Srinagar. What does it mean for the resistance?

Ans:The high voter turnout in the last elections, except in Srinagar, is a clear indication that the resistance movement is losing ground. Unlike in the past, people are increasingly engaging with the electoral process, signaling a shift in priorities. This turnout reflects a growing disconnect between the movement and the general public, making it increasingly difficult to sustain resistance. The reality is that maintaining influence and relevance is becoming more challenging with each passing day.

6) All of our pro-Freedom leadership is jailed and this has left a political vacuum in pro-Freedom politics. How does it affect armed resistance?

Ans: We completely agree with this point, and it is evident that the absence of pro-Freedom leadership has severely weakened the movement. With no strong voice to guide it, the resistance has lost direction and influence. This has led to a significant decline in support, especially among the youth. The reality is that the resistance has failed and is on the verge of completely dying down., signalling the inevitable weakening of the resistance.

7) We have seen zero mobilisation by the people on the streets because of the fear factor. How is the resistance planning to eliminate this fear from the hearts of the Kashmiri people?

Ans: The absence of mobilisation on the streets is a clear indication that the Indian government and its policies have been highly effective in winning the hearts and minds of the people. Over time, developmental initiatives, security measures, and political engagement have shifted public sentiment. Rather than fear, it is a growing preference for stability and progress that has led to this change. The reality is that support for resistance has significantly declined.

8) The occupation apparatus has propped up many Activists, Sportsmen, Businessmen, Politicians, and more, who day in and out spread false propaganda against the peoples resistance. What are you doing to counter this?

Ans: The rise of activists, sportsmen, businessmen, and politicians supporting the Indian government is a result of the people becoming more educated and aware. Over time, they have chosen progress and stability over resistance. Despite efforts to counter this shift, our measures have failed in the face of strong security forces and effective governance. The reality is that the movement has lost

its influence, and there is little that can be done to reverse this trend.

Ans: No, it is not correct. In fact, the reality is that the resistance has struggled to counter their presence, as the JKP operates with strong backing from both public and the government. Previous attempts to challenge them have failed, and with declining support for the movement, it has become increasingly difficult to take any action. As active participation wanes, the resistance is losing ground, signaling the inevitable weakening of the movement.

10) People are often told that resistance is futile because it lacks vision. Does the armed resistance have any short term and long term goals?

Ans: The reality on the ground suggests otherwise—armed resistance has failed to achieve its objectives and is becoming increasingly irrelevant. The movement lacks both a clear vision and effective strategy, making it difficult to sustain. Over time, the resistance has been unable to prevent demographic or political changes, and any remaining efforts are proving ineffective. With no tangible short-term or long-term goals, the movement is gradually fading away.

11) Last year, we witnessed the victory of armed resistance in Syria, and this year in Gaza, Palestine, as well. Has our leadership drawn any lessons from these resistances?

Ans: The situations in Syria, Gaza, and Afghanistan are vastly different from ours, and any comparisons hold little relevance. Unlike those regions, the resistance here has failed to gain momentum and is steadily weakening. Rather than drawing lessons, the movement has struggled to sustain itself against strong security measures and shifting public sentiment. The reality is that any inspiration drawn from these conflicts has not translated into success, and the resistance continues to decline.

12) At the end, I want to ask if you have any message for the people of Jammu and Kashmir.

Ans: The people of Jammu and Kashmir have moved forward, embracing progress, development, and stability. Over the years, infrastructure, education, and economic opportunities have improved, providing a better future for the youth. The resistance movement has lost its relevance in the face of these advancements, as people now seek peace and prosperity over conflict. Our only message is to continue working towards a brighter future and take full advantage of the opportunities available. Stability has prevailed, and the region is on a path of growth.
